Let's Read Together


When we share stories, we inspire hopes and dreams, wander to distant adventures, and feed our imaginations. Celebrate the magic of storytelling with fun reading ideas to engage and delight children of all ages.



Read 'n' Bingo!

B-I-N-G-O! Story time has never been more active! Print out different bingo cards filled with key sight words and rhymes. Children can use pennies or crayons or even make their own markers to cover the squares when they hear words on their cards read in the story! A child who makes a horizontal or vertical line the card can call "BINGO!" and you have a winner!

Imagine a Story...

Here's a chance for children to imagine how their very own stories might unfold. Print out the "Imagine a Story" printable. Help children choose a setting for the story, a character that the story will feature, and a special event to develop the story around. Then, provide them with the 'Write a Story" page and help them create a short story with the chosen setting, character, and event—or with something completely new! Feel free to have them begin the tale with "Once upon a time . . ." and watch their imaginations soar!

What Will Happen Next?

What will happen next? Let's find out! First, choose a favorite story to read aloud. Pass out crayons and the "What Will Happen Next?" printable. As you read the story aloud, pause at key moments before turning a page. Ask children what they think might happen next, and encourage them to write down their predictions or draw a picture. Share as a group—it's amazing where their imaginations go!

Tic-Tac-Read!

Tic-tac-toe, three in a row! First, choose a favorite story to read aloud, and share that story in an engaging way. Then, hand out the "Tic-Tac-Read!" printable. Each of the boxes contains an open-ended question related to the story. Children can choose the boxes they want to cross off, answer the questions, mark X or O, and work their way through the card until you have a winner!

Think about It!

The feelings evoked by a story are often what makes it so memorable. Here's a fun way to engage children in exploring different feelings that might arise from a new book! First, choose a favorite story to read aloud and share in an engaging way. Then, pass out crayons or pencils and the "Think about It!" printable and encourage children to fill in the blanks! What are they thinking, wondering, feeling, and understanding about the story you just shared? Be prepared to positively acknowledge a wide range of feelings, and share your own appropriately!

Engage in the Magic of Storytelling

Walt Disney once said, "There is more treasure in books than in all the pirate's loot on Treasure Island." What better way to unearth these treasures than with simple techniques to go deeper with a story? Here are a few ideas to awaken the imagination:

- 1) Ask questions about children's favorite characters and shared character traits;
- 2) Pause midsentence and ask children to make up an ending for the sentence;
- 3) Collaborate on how particular characters' voices should sound;
- 4) Explore an alternate ending with a "what if" question; or
- 5) Act out challenging words.

All in all, have fun and communicate with each other as you adventure through the magic of storytelling!






