With one of the most brilliant minds in the world, Princess Shuri utilizes her problem-solving skillset to create incredible inventions that advance Wakanda as a country and enhance their capabilities while in battle. From an upgraded Black Panther suit that uses kinetic energy, to harnessing the power of vibranium in different weapons, Shuri's innovative ideas are seemingly endless!

It may seem like Shuri is quick to bring her concepts to life, but it takes time to design, test and readjust ideas until a project reaches its full potential. Scientists, like Shuri, will often follow a design process to help them throughout the development of an idea.

While the methods individuals take may look different depending on the scientist, usually they include core steps:

1

SET THE GOAL

All projects start with a goal because it's important to know what you want to accomplish.

2

PLAN THE DESIGN

Take some time to plan out different design elements that will help you reach your goal.

3

CREATE THE PROTOTYPE

A prototype, or model, is like a first draft!

TEST IT OUT

Try out the prototype a few times to figure out what needs to be redesigned.


IMPROVE THE DESIGN

As a leading scientist, Princess Shuri passes along her technological knowledge and problem solving skills to the next generation of science and engineering leaders, recognizing the importance of inspiring and guiding individuals to achieve success. One such future leader is Riri Williams, a young scientist who receives Shuri's support and mentorship throughout each positive interaction the two share with one another.



LINKED TO THE LANDSCAPE

While Shuri views vibranium as an invaluable tool, not all Wakandans accept the use of this powerful natural resource. M'Baku embodies traditionalism and opposes the use of technology-driven innovations. Though Shuri and M'Baku may have been shaped differently by their experiences, both mainstream and traditional Wakandans are linked to the landscape by the natural resources found within it.

Natural resources are provided by nature and play important roles in their ecosystem—trees for example, provide shelter for wildlife. Sometimes humans use natural resources, but like Shuri and her team of scientists, we can also harness the abilities of natural resources and turn them into other useful products. You may enjoy the fruit produced by many different kinds of trees but also use products that are made from trees like paper or pencils. So how do you balance conserving natural resources with using what you need? First you need to know what natural resources you use!

CONSERVE RESOURCES

The best first step in learning how to conserve natural resources is to understand how you use them. Natural resources can be turned into countless products that are important for every day life, but we need to be mindful of balancing our needs with the needs of future generations. 


Okoye, general of the Dora Milaje and leader of Wakanda's armies, knows what it means to be a trusted and loyal ally. Having experienced many battles, she is a fierce warrior and skilled with her vibranium spear. Attuma is from Talokan, a kingdom hidden in the depths of the ocean and ruled by Namor. He is the strongest general in Namor's army and possesses a high level of boldness.




Biodiversity describes differences found in nature, which is important for healthy ecosystems because everything has an important role in keeping the environment strong.

Stories can be told in many ways:





No matter the form, all storytelling is rooted in connecting the past to the present and future.




Swap stories with a friend to learn more about each other, or see if you can translate your comic strip into another form of storytelling like dance!
