FINISHED SIZE: approximately 2.75" tall

This little astromech droid copilots for Poe Dameron's starfighter for the Resistance. After being left on Jakku, BB-8 is found by Rey and becomes an essential part of her adventure with Finn.

MATERIALS

See note on yarn, p. 6

- · White yarn (approx. 15 g)
- Light gray yarn (approx. 5 g)
- · Orange yarn (approx. 5 g)
- E/4 (3.5 mm) hook
- Tapestry needle

- 9 mm black plastic safety eye
- 6 mm black plastic safety eye
- Stuffing
- Stitch marker

BODY: Start with light gray yarn.

Rnd 1: ch 2, work 6 sc into first ch—6 st.

Change to white yarn.

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each st around—12 st.

• Change to orange yarn.

Rnd 3: [sc in next st, sc and spike st in next st, sc in next st] 4 times—
16 st.

• Change to white yarn.

Rnd 4: [2 sc in next st, sc in next st] 8 times—24 st.

Rnd 5: [2 sc in next st, sc in next 3 st] 6 times—30 st.

Rnds 6–13: (8 rounds) sc in each st around—30 st.

Rnd 14: [sc2tog, sc in next 3 st] 6 times—24 st.

• Change to orange yarn.

Rnd 15: [sc2tog, sc in next st] 8 times—16 st.

- Start to stuff body.
- Change to white yarn.

Rnd 16: [sc2tog, sc in next 2 st] 4 times—12 st.

Change to light gray yarn.

Rnd 17: [sc2tog] 6 times—6 st. FO, leaving a length of yarn.

• Finish stuffing firmly, then neatly sew up the hole at the base. (Completed body, top: Fig. A, bottom: Fig. B)

CIRCULAR PANELS (make 4): Start with light gray yarn.

Rnd 1: ch 2, work 6 sc into first ch—6 st.

• Change to white yarn.


Rnd 2: 2 sc in each st around—12 st.

Change to orange yarn.

Rnd 3: [sc in next st, sc and spike st in next st, sc in next st] 4 times—
16 st.

Change to white yarn.

Rnd 4: [2 sc in next st, sc in next st] 8 times—24 st. Sl st in next st. FO, leaving a length of yarn.

- Secure and trim all the ends.
- Pin each panel in place on the white part of the body so that they are equally spaced. Sew neatly around the edges, making sure that they are as flat as possible. (Fig. C—page 21)

HEAD: Start with white yarn.

Rnd 1: ch 2, work 6 sc into first ch—6 st.

Change to light gray yarn.

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each st around—12 st.

Change to white yarn.

Rnd 3: [2 sc in next st, sc in next st] 6 times—18 st.

Rnd 4: [2 sc in next st, sc in next 5 st] 3 times—21 st.

Rnds 5–6: (2 rounds) sc in each st around—21 st.

Change to light gray yarn.

Rnd 7: sc in each st around—21 st.

Change to white yarn.

Rnd 8: in BLO, [sc2tog, sc in next 5 st] 3 times—18 st.

- Secure your current loop with a stitch marker so your work doesn't come undone.
- With the start of the round at the back, insert the 9 mm eye at the front, between rounds 4 and 5. Insert the 6 mm eye between rounds 5 and 6, three stitches to the right

as you are facing it. (Fig. D) Do not secure the eyes with the washers on the back yet.

- To make the orange lines on the head, you will work slip stitches along the surface into the holes between stitches.
- Insert your hook between rounds 3 and 4, two stitches to the right of the larger eye as you are facing it. Pull a loop of orange yarn from underneath and through the hole, then work 14 sl st around in a circle, pulling the yarn from underneath for each stitch. Finish one stitch away from the larger eye on the other side. FO and weave in the ends on the inside.
- Insert your hook between rounds 6 and 7, one stitch to the right of the smaller eye as you are facing it. Pull a loop of orange yarn from underneath and through the hole, then work 16 sl st around in a circle, pulling the yarn from underneath

for each stitch. (Fig. E) Finish one stitch away from the larger eye on the other side. FO and weave in the ends on the inside.

- Fix the washers on the backs of the safety eyes. (Fig. F)
- Stuff head.

Rnd 9: [sc2tog, sc in next st] 6 times—12 st.

Rnd 10: [sc2tog] 6 times—6 st. FO, leaving a length of yarn.

• Finish stuffing, then sew the hole up neatly. Sew head onto body so that the edge of the head is touching the middle of round 1. Do not sew into the gray part of the head; sew into round 8 of the head.

Obi-Wan Kenobi

FINISHED SIZE: approximately 3.5" tall

A Jedi who fought in the Clone Wars with Anakin Skywalker, Obi-Wan settled on Tatooine after the fall of the Jedi Order to watch over Luke Skywalker. After joining Luke to help the Rebel Alliance, he was struck down on the Death Star by Darth Vader, but his spirit lived on in the Force.

MATERIALS

See note on yarn, p. 6

- Light gray yarn (approx. 5 g)
- Pale peach yarn (approx. 5 g)
- Beige yarn (approx. 10 g)
- Brown yarn (approx. 15 g)
- · Small amount of black embroidery thread (for mouth)
- Stuffing
- · Pair of black plastic safety eyes $(7.5 \, \text{mm})$
- E/4 (3.5 mm) hook
- Tapestry needle
- · Stitch marker

BEARD: Light gray yarn.

Row 1: ch 3, work 4 dc in first ch, ch 3, turn.

Row 2: skip ch next to hook, sl st in next 2 ch, sc in next dc, ch 4, skip next 2 dc, sc in next dc, ch 2, turn. (Fig. A)

Row 3: skip ch next to hook, sl st in next ch. FO, leaving a length of yarn.

HEAD AND BODY: Start with light gray yarn.

Rnd 1: ch 2, work 6 sc into first ch—6 st.

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each st around—12 st.

Rnd 3: [2 sc in next st, sc in next st] 6 times—18 st.

Rnd 4: [2 sc in next st, sc in next 2 st] 6 times—24 st.

Rnds 5–6: (2 rounds) sc in each st around—24 st.

Rnd 7: change to pale peach yarn, sc in next 9 st, change to light gray yarn, sc in next 15 st—24 st.

Rnd 8: change to pale peach yarn, sc in next 9 st, change to light gray yarn, sc in next 15 st—24 st.

Rnd 9: change to pale peach yarn, sc in next 10 st, change to light gray yarn, sc in next 14 st—24 st.

Rnd 10: change to pale peach yarn, sc in next 10 st, change to light gray yarn, sc in next 14 st—24 st.

Rnd 11: change to pale peach yarn, sc in next 11 st, change to light gray yarn, sc in next 12 st, change to pale peach yarn, sc in next st—24 st.

Rnd 12: [sc2tog, sc in next 2 st] 6 times—18 st.

• Fit eyes between rounds 9 and 10, six stitches apart.

Rnd 13: [sc2tog, sc in next st] 6 times-12 st.

Change to brown yarn.

Rnd 14: [2 sc in next st, sc in next st] 6 times—18 st.

Change to beige yarn.

Rnd 15: sc in next 3 st, change to brown yarn, sc in next 3 st, change to beige yarn, sc in next 12 st—18 st.

Rnd 16: sc in next 4 st, change to brown yarn, sc in next st, change to beige yarn, sc in next 13 st—18 st.

Rnds 17-18: (2 rounds) sc in each st around-18 st.

Change to brown yarn.

Rnd 19: sc in each st around—18 st.

- · Stuff head.
- Pin the beard onto the face and sew in place with the loop of chains

at the top making the moustache. The sections at the side join up to the hair. (Fig. B—page 47)

- Using black thread, sew a mouth so that it can be seen under the moustache. (Fig. C—page 47)
- Change to beige yarn.

Rnd 20: [2 sc in next st, sc in next 5 st] 3 times—21 st.

Rnd 21: sc in each st around—21 st.

Rnd 22: [2 sc in next st, sc in next 6 stl 3 times—24 st.

Rnd 23: sc in each st around—24 st.

Rnd 24: [2 sc in next st, sc in next 7 st] 3 times—27 st.

Rnds 25–26: (2 rounds) sc in each st around-27 st.

Change to brown yarn.

To mark the feet: Find the stitch in round 26 that is in the front middle of the body. Then count back six stitches before that (not including the middle stitch) and mark this stitch.

Rnd 27: in BLO for the whole round, sc in each st around until you get to the marked stitch.

To make feet: Work a 3dc bob in each of next 4 st, sc in next 5 st, work a 3dc bob in each of next 4 st. Sc in each st around to the end of the round—27 st.

- Make sure the bobbles that make up the feet are pushed outward.
- Finish stuffing head and most of body firmly.

Rnd 28: [sc2tog, sc in next st] 9 times—18 st.

Rnd 29: [sc2tog, sc in next st] 6 times—12 st.

Rnd 30: [sc2tog] 6 times—6 st. FO, leaving a length of yarn.

 Finish stuffing firmly, then sew the hole at the base up neatly, and pull the yarn up tightly through the body to make sure the base lies flat. Take the yarn through the body again (not tightly) and then cut it.

ARMS (make 2): Start with pale peach yarn.

Rnd 1: ch 2, work 6 sc into first ch—6 st.

Rnd 2: sc in each st around—6 st.

Change to beige yarn.

Rnd 3: [2 sc in next st, sc in next st] 3 times—9 st.

Rnds 4-6: (3 rounds) sc in each st around—9 st.

Rnd 7: sc2tog, sc in next 7 st—8 st. Rnds 8–9: (2 rounds) sc in each st around—8 st.

Rnd 10: [sc2tog, sc in next 2 st] 2 times—6 st. SI st in next st, then FO, leaving a length of yarn.

 Stuff the ends of the arms slightly, then sew the arms to the body.


ROBE: Brown yarn. Start with the hood:

· Ch 24.


Row 1: sc in second ch from hook, sc in next 22 ch, ch 1, turn—23 st. Rows 2-9: (8 rows) sc in next 23 st, ch 1, turn—23 st.

Row 10: sc2tog, sc in next 7 st, sc2tog, sc in next st, sc2tog, sc in next 7 st, sc2tog, ch 1, turn—19 st.

Row 11: sc2tog, sc in next 5 st, sc2tog, sc in next st, sc2tog, sc in

next 5 st, sc2tog—15 st. FO, leaving length of yarn.

• Fold in half and, using the length of yarn, sew up the back of the hood along the sides of rows 10 and 11 and then along the top of row 11. Weave in ends. (Fig. D—page 49)

Rest of robe:

Hold the hood upside down with the outside facing you and join in yarn to bottom of hood on the right.

Row 1: sc into the same point, then do 17 more sc, evenly spaced along the bottom of the hood. Ch 1, turn—18 st.

Row 2: sc in next 2 st, ch 5, skip next 4 st, sc in next 6 st, ch 5, skip next 4 st, sc in next 2 st, ch 1, turn—20 st.

Row 3: sc in next 2 st, work 5 sc around ch 5, sc in next 6 st, work 5 sc around ch 5, sc in next 2 st, ch 1, turn—20 st.

Rows 4–6: (3 rows) sc in next 20 st, ch 1, turn—20 st.



Row 7: 2 sc in next st, sc in next 5 st, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 6 st, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 5 st, 2 sc in next st, ch 1, turn—24 st.

Rows 8–10: (3 rows) sc in next 24 st, ch 1, turn—24 st.

Row 11: 2 sc in next st, sc in next 7 st, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 6 st, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 7 st, 2 sc in next st, ch 1, turn—28 st.

Row 12: sc in next 28 st, ch 1, turn—28 st.

Row 13: sl st in next 28 st, FO—28 st. Weave in any loose ends.

SLEEVES (make 2):

• Ch 11.

Row 1: sc in second ch from hook, sc in next 9 ch, ch 1, turn—10 st.

Row 2: sc in next 10 st, ch 1, turn—10 st.

Row 3: 2 sc in next st, sc in next 8 st, 2 sc in next st, ch 1, turn—12 st.

Row 4: sc in next 12 st, ch 1, turn—12 st.

Row 5: 2 sc in next st, sc in next 10 st, 2 sc in next st, ch 1, turn—14 st.

Row 6: sc in next 14 st, ch 1, turn—14 st.

Row 7: 2 sc in next st, sc in next 12 st, 2 sc in next st, ch 1, turn—16 st.

Row 8: sc in next 16 st—16 st. FO, leaving length of yarn.

• Fold each sleeve in half and sew edges together, making a tube that is wider at one end than the other. (Fig. E—page 49) With the seam facing down, pin the narrower end of each sleeve into an armhole and sew in place. Weave in any loose ends. (Fig. F—page 49)

Technology

What would your droid name be?

Droid designations are typically a combination of letters and numbers. C-3PO, R2-D2, and BB-8 are arguably the most wellknown droids in the galaxy. Other droid heroes include BD-1, L3-37, K-2SO, C1-10P, AP-5, 2-1B, D-0, and B2EMO. Droids can be villainous as well, as with 0-0-0 and BT-1.



Technology

What is your favorite **Star Wars** starship?

The starships of *Star Wars* have personalities of their own. Among them are sturdy freighters such as the *Millennium Falcon* and the *Ghost*, and warships such as the menacing Star Destroyers. Smaller short-range fighters include Naboo N-1 starfighters, X-wings, Y-wings, A-wings, B-wings, TIE fighters, and TIE interceptors.

If you could have just one Force ability in real life, which one would you pick? Why?

Jedi Knights use incredible Force abilities, such as the Jedi mind touch, which plants strong suggestions in another mind.
